## **SECTION 4. First aid measures**

4.1. Description of first aid measures.

EYES: Remove contact lenses, if present. Wash immediately with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, opening the eyelids fully. Get medical advice/attention.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**
